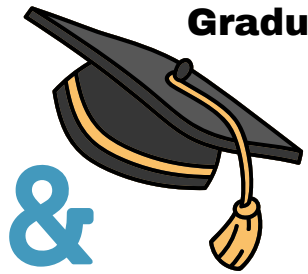

Financial Aid

We recommend completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) to access financial aid options that can help offset college costs. In addition, other financial aid options include private loans, scholarships, and grants from federal and state governments, as well as individual colleges.
